The Argument So Far

God of the whole world, not just Jews
God-fearing Gentiles part of redemption
Redemption to Edenic State

Hope for the Resurrection

²⁴ For in this hope [of the resurrection] we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what he sees?

²⁵ But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience.

The Spirit's Intercession

²⁶ Likewise the Spirit [of God] helps us in our weakness. For we do not know what to pray for as we ought, but the Spirit [of God] himself intercedes for us with groanings too deep for words.

²⁷ And he who searches hearts knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God. (Cf. Proverbs 20:27)

All Things Work Together

²⁸ And we know that for those [Jews and God-fearing Gentile believers] who love God all [the following] things work together for good, for those who are called [by God to belong to Yeshua the Messiah and to be Saints (cf. Rom 1:6-7)] according to his purpose [of redemption].

Foreknowledge and Predestination

²⁹ For those whom he foreknew [in the spiritual state of the pre-existent neshamah] he also predestined [i.e., assigned to a mission] to be conformed to the image of his Son [i.e. the divine Adam (cf. Rom 5:14) through means of the resurrection], in order that he might be the firstborn [son of God] among many brothers.

Cf. Jeremiah 1:5; Isaiah 49:1

³⁰ And those whom he predestined [for the mission of being conformed to the image of his Son] he also called, and those whom he called he also justified [i.e. exonerated in the final judgment], and those whom he justified [in the final judgment] he also glorified [in the resurrection of the dead].

A Missing False-Premise

³¹ What then shall we say to these things? [That "there is condemnation for those who are in the Messiah Yeshua" (cf. Romans 8:1). By no means!] If God is for us, who can be against us?

³² He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things [including the resurrection and exoneration in the final judgment]?

³³ Who shall bring any charge against God's elect [a term which ordinarily applies exclusively to Israel]? It is God who justifies.

³⁴ Who is to condemn? Christ Jesus [is in the position of authority to judge, and He] is the one who died--more than that, who was raised--who is at the right hand of God, who indeed is interceding for us.

More than Conquerors

35 Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? [What then shall we say?]

Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword [separate us]?

³⁶ As it is written [in Psalm 44:22], "For your sake we are being killed all the day long; we are regarded as sheep to be slaughtered."

³⁷ No, in all these things we are more than conquerors *[in the arena]* through him who loved us.

No Separation

³⁸ For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present [in this current age] nor things to come [in the kingdom and the world to come], nor [spiritual] powers,

³⁹ nor height [of heaven above] nor depth [of Sheol below], nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.
